Math: Days, Weeks, Months and Years

To Anna, time is moving very slowly. The first line in this chapter says, "Days went by, days that felt like weeks to Anna." Sometimes, when we're waiting for a special day, or we're really bored, it can feel like time is taking longer than usual but, rest assured, time is moving at the same speed it always does.

There are always 24 hours in each day and always seven days in each week. Most months have 30 or 31 days in them. February is the only one that has fewer days.
