Life Skills: Composting

As Anna was walking through the woods, she noticed the wood turning into soil. When this happens, it's called *decomposition*. All organic matter breaks down after it is no longer alive. In nature, when this matter breaks down, it returns to the soil, providing nutrients that help more plants grow. It's a lot like recycling!

Many people help their own gardens grow by composting, a similar process of using decomposing organic matter to help nourish the soil. You can learn more about composting and, if you get permission, you might want to try it yourself.
