

Try one of these creative projects to express your feelings, opinions and what you learned from this book:

- Create a poster: Using materials you have on hand, create a poster that shows your favorite part.
- Illustrate the story: Retell the story of Anna and the High Willow in the form of a graphic novel or comic strip.
- Make a timeline: Make a timeline of events in the story. If you want to use a template, you can find several here:

- Interview Anna: Think of a series of questions you would ask Anna and how she would answer them. Have a partner (a grown up or sibling will do!), ask you the questions and answer them as Anna would.
- Act out the story: If you have enough people, act out the story as a play. If you want to do this alone, pick a scene from the book that involves only Anna.
- Be Master Mellwyn: Retell the story from Master Mellwyn's perspective.

- Hold a debate: With a friend, hold a debate about Master Mellwyn's actions in the story. Was he right or wrong to do what he did? One person should argue why he was right and the other person should argue why he was wrong.
- Host a book reading: Get together with your friends (if you can't meet in person, get permission to set up a video call) and take turns reading and discussing each chapter.
